Junior Interpretative Speech Presentation Rules (Dramatic, Humorous, Open and DUO)

Interpretative speech events allow students to present a wide variety of literary styles including original writing.

RULES:

- 1. You may use traditionally published literature or original writing. Examples include prose, poetry, short stories, plays, historical speeches, and children's books.
- 2. Media transcription from movies, television, or tape recordings are not allowed.
- 3. The title and author of the selection must be introduced.
- 4. Students may use up to 150 of their own words anywhere in the presentation.
- 5. No props, costumes, audiovisuals, or vulgarity is allowed.
- 6. Limited singing and dancing is permitted but must be purposeful and motivated by the literature.
- 7. Only the presenter's feet are permitted to touch the floor.
- 8. If performing a DUO Interpretation, presenters must not touch or look at their partner. Also, lines should be shared as equally as possible between the partners.
- 9. Memorization is required. No scripts, notes, or prompting are allowed.
- 10.An average presentation time limit of 5 minutes is encouraged but not required. No student will be penalized for going over or under the suggested time.
